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We are a King James Bible believing ministry. During the Tribulation, the anti-christ, indwelled by Satan, sits on the throne in King Solomon's rebuilt temple and declares himself to be god.

What makes you think that Satan would not counterfeit God's Word in The Holy Bible?

Of course Satan counterfeited God's Word. There are literally scores of different bible versions on the market today. All of them are different from each other. Common sense dictates that they all can not be correct. Things that are different are obviously not the same. There are vast differences in the text of the other versions of the Bible. Some leave out very important references to the deity of Jesus Christ, others leave out references to the “blood”. Overall there are literally thousands of significant word changes in the modern versions. The King James Bible is very unique, so are the King James Bible believers. King James Bible believers are the only group of “Christians” who claim to have God's

Holy, Inspired, Preserved, Inerrant Word. All other Christians and non-Christians alike will tell you that no Bible is without errors. The scoffers say that all Bibles were translated by men and therefore contain errors. The Bible tells you otherwise.

**“For the prophecy came not in old time
by the will of man: but holy men of
God spake as they were moved by
the Holy Ghost.”
(2Peter 1:21)**

God tells you that he will preserve his word.

**“The words of the LORD are pure words as silver tried
in a furnace of earth, purified seven times. Thou shalt
keep them, O LORD, thou shalt preserve them from
this generation for ever.”
(Psalm 12:6-7)**

If this is true and God has promised to preserve his word forever, the obvious question would be, where is it. King James Bible Believers apparently are the only people that know where the Word of God is, it is in the KJV only.

The Bible also tells you three times, once at the beginning, again in the middle and at the end, not to add to God's Word and not to take away from God's Word. Every false bible on the market (every non KJV) has violated this commandment by either adding or subtracting to God's Word. Remember, if God tells you something three times, he means it.

**“at the mouth of two witnesses, or at
the mouth of three witnesses, shall
the matter be established.”
(Deuteronomy 19:15)**

Casting doubt on God's Word and then changing what he actually said is one of the oldest “tricks in the book” and has been around since the Garden of Eden and the beginning of time. In Genesis Chapter 3 the serpent (satan) says to Eve “Yea, hath God Said...”, hoping to cast doubt in Eve's mind about what God actually said.

**“And the woman said unto the serpent,
We may eat of the fruit of the trees of
the garden: But of the fruit of the tree
which is in the midst of the garden, God
hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither
shall ye touch it, lest ye die.
(Genesis 3:2-3)**

What God actually said to Adam, is recorded in Genesis 2:16-17. Eve changed what God said. She omitted the word “freely” and added the words “neither shall ye touch it.” This combination has been around ever since. Satan casts doubt about the authenticity of Gods preserved word in the KJV, then man changes God’s Word. The end result is scores of different bible versions that dilute the Word of God, relinquishing It of It’s power.

God is not kidding about altering his Word.

**“Ye shall not add unto the word which I command
you, neither shall ye diminish ought from it, that ye may keep the com-
mandments of the LORD your God which I command you.”
Deuteronomy 4:2**

There is a severe penalty to pay for altering God’s Word.

**“For I testify unto every man that heareth the words of the prophecy of this
book, If any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the
plagues that are written in this book: And if any man shall take away from
the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of
the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the
things which are written in this book.”
Revelation 22:18-19**

That should be a big enough deterrent to prevent people from altering God’s Word but unfortunately it is not.

It is not our intention to do an extensive treatise on why the King James version is the only Inspired and Preserved Word of God. Extensive works have been done on this subject by men and women much more qualified than ourselves. Later we will list our favorite authors and the books they wrote comparing bible versions and proving well beyond any doubt the satanic origin of all other bibles. The words **“the Lord”** are the exact center.

Now look at the very last verse in the King James Bible.

“The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen.”
Revelation 22:21

If you are saying to yourself, Oh, that’s just a coincidence, please keep reading. We have just started. By the time you finish this book, you will be telling other people

that there is no such thing as a coincidence. God said, **“I am
God...in the midst.”** (Hosea 11:9)

Jesus is the “I” in I am

(Gail Riplinger—The Language of the King James Bible)

Satan, being the over zealous counterfeiter that he is said “I am a God...in the midst...” Ezekiel 28:2

There are so many things unique to the King James Bible. It contains a built in dictionary and progressive revelation that assists with memory retention. The King James Bible is filled with sayings that we use every day. People are quoting from the King James Bible everyday and they don't even realize it. Here are just a few of the many every day sayings derived from a King James Bible.

“**apple of his eye**” In Deuteronomy 32:10, the Lord calls Jacob the apple of his eye.

“**He found him in a desert land, and in the waste howling wilderness; he led him about, he instructed him, he kept him as the apple of his eye.**” (Deuteronomy 32:10)

”don’t know if he’s coming or going” In 1Kings 3:7, Solomon doesn’t know whether he is coming or going.

“And now, O LORD my God, thou hast made thy servant king instead of David my father: and I am but a little child: ”I know not how to go out or come in.””
1Kings 3:5

“it’s water under the bridge” This saying is generally used to denote something that has past or something that you are trying to forget.

“Because thou shalt forget thy misery, and remember it as waters that pass away:”
Job 11:16

“his day is coming” This saying is usually used after someone has wronged you, in hope that something bad happens to the person who has wronged you. In Psalm 37:13, God is talking about the wicked.

“The LORD shall laugh at him: for he seeth that his day is coming.”
Psalm 37:13

“dumb as an ox” People often say “he’s as dumb as an ox.” The reason an ox is considered dumb is because he will walk willingly to his own death.

“He goeth after her straightway, as an ox goeth to the slaughter, or as a fool to the correction of the stocks;”
Proverbs 8:22

“spare the rod, spoil the child” This saying is actually quite milder than the way the Bible puts it. The Bible says if you “spare the rod”, you hate your son.

“He that spareth his rod hateth his son: but he that loveth him chasteneth him betimes.”
Proverbs 13:24

“money talks” This saying is self explanatory and can be found in Ecclesiastes 10:19

“A feast is made for laughter, and wine maketh merry: but money answereth all things.”
Ecclesiastes 10:19

The King James Bible is full of sayings just like these. Gail Riplinger in her book *The Language of the King James Bible*, lists 75 of these every day sayings with their corresponding bible address. She also mentions what happens when the counterfeit bibles are checked for the same verses. In the majority of the cases, the saying is destroyed by bible correctors in their satanic counterfeit versions of The Holy Bible. In Deuteronomy 24:5 the King James Bible tells you to “cheer up”, if you read the New King James Bible, you will have to “bring happiness” to yourself.

THE TRINITY

Although the word “trinity” is nowhere to be found in the Bible, the concept of the trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) is recorded throughout the entire Book. The Trinity is in the beginning, the middle and the end of The Book as well as many places in between. Lets look at the first three verses in Genesis.

Genesis 1

¹“In the beginning God (FATHER) created the heaven and the earth.”

²And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit (HOLY SPIRIT) of God moved upon the face of the waters.”

**³And God said, Let there be light:
and there was light. (SON)**

In the Gospel of John, John tells us that Jesus Christ is the Light of this world. In John 9:5, Jesus says,

**“As long as I am in the world,
I am the light of the world.”
John 9:5**

Now if we go to the end of the Book, we will see the “trinity” again. Turn in your Bible to Revelation 22:19-21, the last three verses in the Bible.

¹⁹“And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God (father) shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book.

²⁰He which testifieth these things (Holy Spirit*) saith, Surely I come quickly. Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus.

**²¹The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ (Son) be with you all. Amen”
Revelation 22:19-21**

*** “it is now revealed unto his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit;”

WHAT IS IN A NUMBER?

Most of us are familiar with the important role that numbers play in the King James Bible. Numbers such as three, seven, forty and seventy are used over and over and have certain attributes attached to them. For instance the number forty is considered to be the number of testing. Why?, because Jesus was tempted by the devil for 40 days and Moses was on the mountain for 40 days. Also after Noah completed the ark, it rained for 40 days and 40 nights. Most people don't realize that God has validated his Word by using numbers in another not so obvious way.

BIBLE CODE

Al Neal has discovered an amazing code contained within the pages of The King James Bible. He calls this code "The Infinity Code." Al realized that every word in the Bible has a numerical equivalent. Once you figure out the numerical equivalent for a word, you count that many chapters into the Bible and your word will be there within that chapter. Once in a while the actual word is not there, but the idea is portrayed. For example, we will look at the word "number."

The Hebrew letters for the word “numbers” were written out. Each letter has a numerical equivalent. Vowels have no numerical equivalent. The corresponding numbers were added and the total was 345. Next we go to the 345th chapter of the King James Bible and we come to 1 Chronicles 7. We are looking for the word number.

1 CHRONICLES 7

²they were valiant men of might in their generations; whose number was in the days of David...

⁹And the number of them, after their genealogy by their generations...

⁴⁰.... And the number throughout the genealogy of them that were apt to the war and to battle was twenty and six thousand men.

We found the word “number” in 1Chronicles 7, three times. We will try another example, the word “rod.”

The 54th chapter of the Bible is Exodus 4. We are looking for the word “rod” to appear somewhere in the chapter.

EXODUS: Chapter 4

²And the LORD said unto him, What is that in thine hand?
And he said, A rod.

⁴And the LORD said unto Moses, Put forth thine hand, and take it by the tail. And he put forth his hand, and caught it, and it became a rod in his hand:

¹⁷And thou shalt take this rod in thine hand, wherewith thou shalt do signs.

²⁰And Moses took his wife and his sons, and set them upon an ass, and he returned to the land of Egypt: and Moses took the rod of God in his hand.

The word “rod” was found four times in the 54th chapter of the Bible which is Exodus chapter 4. This is not a coincidence. Al Neal claims to have run over 400 words or phrases and come up with matches for those words in each corresponding chapter of the Bible.

We will give you a few examples that you can try on your own. We will give you a list of words, their corresponding numerical equivalents and the chapter in the Bible to look for the word.

The first time that it appears is in 1Chronicles 21:1 “And **Satan** stood up against Israel, and provoked David to number Israel.” 1 Chronicles 21:1 is the 359th chapter in the King James Bible. There is another word that is similar to “satan”, it is “santa”, it has the exact same numerical equivalent of “satan.”

“TYPES” IN THE BIBLE

The King James Bible utilizes another literary method to validate itself. This method is commonly referred to as “typology.” Typology is when you are given a glimpse or foreshadowing of a person or event by studying a similar person or event. For instance, a “type” of Jesus Christ would be a person who displayed one or more attributes of Jesus himself. There are several “types” of Jesus Christ portrayed in the King James Bible. This is another good reason not to alter God’s Word. When the words are changed, the significance of the “type” is often lost. Here are several types of Jesus Christ as portrayed in your King James Bible.

Joseph (Genesis 37 - 50) who first suffered for no fault of his own, but was promoted to second in the kingdom of Egypt by virtue of his wisdom - depicts the suffering Christ who is exalted to the right hand of God. (Acts 7:56)

Joshua and the conquest of Canaan - who depicts the return of Jesus in triumph at the end of this age. Note: The books of Joshua and Revelation should be considered in conjunction. There are many parallels.

Boas The Redeemer Kinsman - is a type of the relationship we have with Jesus who has redeemed us from death and sin.

David and the other "good" kings of Israel and Judah - who depict the glory of Jesus as King of all the world.

Esther, the intercessor - who is a type of Jesus who intercedes for us before His Father in Heaven. (Hebrews 7:25) and also a type of the Church and its relationship between the world and Jesus as we act as God's "Royal Priesthood" (1 Peter 2:9) interceding for Adam's fallen race.

Elijah- who is a type of the ascended Christ.

Just as there are types of Jesus Christ in the Bible, there are also types of the anti-christ, evil men in the Bible who displayed one or more qualities normally attributed to the anti-christ.

TYPES OF THE ANTI-CHRIST

1. **Cain**. It is indeed solemn to discover that the very first man born into this world prefigured the Man of Sin. He did so in a least seven respects. First, we may observe that in 1 John 3:12 we are told "Cain was of that Wicked One, i.e. the Devil. Of none other is this particular expression used.

2. **Lamech**

The record of this man's life is exceedingly brief, but from the little that is recorded about him we may discover at least seven parallelisms between him and the Antichrist. First, the meaning of his name. Lamech signifies "powerful". This was an appropriate name for one who foreshadowed the Man of Sin who, as the Head of the United States of the World, will be powerful governmentally. He will also be mighty in his person, for we are told that the Dragon shall give power unto him (Rev. 13:4). Second, in the fact that Lamech was a descendant of Cain (Gen. 4:17-19), not Seth, we see that he sprang from the evil line. Third, he was the seventh from fallen Adam, as though to intimate that the cycle of depravity was completed in him. So the Antichrist will be not only the culmination of satanic craft and power, but as well, the climax of human wickedness - the Man of Sin. Fourth, the first thing predicted of Lamech is his "lawlessness".

3. **Nimrod.** This personal type of the Antichrist is deeply interesting and remarkable full in its details. His exploits are recorded in Gen. 10 and 11, and it is most significant that his person and history are there introduced at the point immediately preceding God's call of Abraham from among the Gentiles and His bringing him into the promised land. Thus will history repeat itself. Just before God again gathers Abraham's descendants from out of the lands of the Gentiles. (The Anti-Christ by Arthur W. Pink)

These “types, when considered together, are designed to give the reader a much clearer picture of the person they are representing. After all, that is how we are told to study our bibles. We are to get a little information from one place and more information from another place.

“But the word of the LORD was unto them precept upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little;”
Isaiah 28:13

This is one of the reasons Scripture often has dual meanings. The Bible is describing an actual person or event in their historical setting while at the same time giving a glimpse or foreshadowing of a future event or person. Daniel 9:26 is a perfect example of this.

“And after threescore and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off, but not for himself: and the people of the prince that shall come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary; and the end thereof shall be with a flood, and unto the end of the war desolations are determined.”
Daniel 9:26

The Messiah was “cut off” when he was crucified in 29 A.D. or there about. The sanctuary (King Solomon's

Second Temple) was destroyed in approximately 70 A.D along with the city of Jerusalem by the Romans. This prophecy also has a future fulfillment. We know that because when Jesus Christ was crucified, God's timetable for dealing with the Jews temporarily stopped. This time period, from the crucifixion until present is commonly known as the "church age." After the church is raptured, God will again start dealing with the Jews. This period is known as The Tribulation. That is where this scripture has its ultimate fulfillment. The "prince" that shall come is a reference to the anti-christ who will defile the sanctuary (third Temple) and destroy Jerusalem.

"And the serpent cast out of his mouth water as a flood after the woman, that he might cause her to be carried away of the flood. And the earth helped the woman, and the earth opened her mouth, and swallowed up the flood which the dragon cast out of his mouth."

Revelation 12:15-16

"..the end there of shall be with a flood..."

Daniel 9:26

SIMILITUDES

Similar to types and typology, similitude's are used to make a comparison between two seemingly unrelated things.

things. The Bible says that God's word is like food.

**“But he answered and said, It is written,
Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that
proceedeth out of the mouth of God.”**

Matthew 4:4

When you are a “babe” in Christ, you drink milk.

**“As newborn babes, desire the
sincere milk of the word, that ye
may grow thereby:”**

By now it should be obvious, the importance that God places on each and every word in the King James Bible.

“..Man shall not live by *bread* alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.”

Matthew 4:4

God not only reveres each and every word in the Bible, but jots and tittles too. Jots and tittles are punctuation marks.

“For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled.”

Matthew 5:18

“And it is easier for heaven and earth to pass, than one tittle of the law to fail.”

Matthew 16:17

Placing one “jot” or one “tittle” in the wrong place could land you in a completely different dispensation. It could also mean the difference between the first coming of Jesus Christ as a Lamb and the second coming of Jesus Christ as a Lion.

“Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will raise unto David a righteous Branch, (1st coming)

**and a King shall reign and prosper, and shall execute judgment and justice in the earth.” (2nd coming)
Jeremiah 23:5**

A comma also is used to separate the rapture of the church and the second coming of Jesus Christ when both events occur in the same sentence.

**“Looking for that blessed hope, (rapture) and the glorious appearing (2nd coming) of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ;”
Titus 2:13**

God reveres his word. He does not want man altering his word one bit. Just how important are God’s Words?

**“Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away.”
Matthew 24:35**

**“for thou hast magnified thy word above all thy name.”
Psalm 138:2**

In conclusion, in case you are not sure about changing God’s Word because your other “bible” is easier to read or your pastor told you incorrectly that there are errors in all “bibles” or perhaps you think what is the difference. The difference is the “penalty.”

**“...If any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the plagues that are written in this book: And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book.”
Revelation 22:18-19**
